Housing and Social Segregation – Experience of Northern Ireland

Over the last century housing provision and, in particular, the provision of social housing within the island of Ireland has developed through government policy and funding priorities. With the division of governance of the country in the 1920s these policies and priorities have diversified as the governments sought to meet the challenges arising within their individual jurisdictions. As a result, today it is possible to observe different housing tenures and approaches in both areas, and in particular within non-market housing commonly referred to as social housing. This lecture will look at religious segregation in Northern Ireland and how it is particularly located in public housing estates. It will look at emerging issues including the Shared Future framework that has been put in place by the Northern Ireland Assembly and the need for a tolerant and respectful agenda for both communities. It will look at the emerging affordability crisis in Northern Ireland and how many people are now excluded from owner occupation and yet there has been a diminishing social rented sector with rising waiting lists. It will look at recent initiatives to try to reduce social segregation and the move towards mixed income communities.

Paddy Gray is Director of Teaching and Learning, School of Built Environment, University of Ulster and Professor of Real Estate, Spiru Haret University, Romania. He has wide experience of academic and applied research in Housing Management and Housing Policy in the UK and Republic of Ireland and has over 90 publications on housing relate issues. He acted as Expert Advisor to NI Assembly Social Development Committee on the Inquiry into Housing in 2002 and expert witness to the Parliamentary Sub-committee on Northern Ireland Affairs in 2004. He is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Housing and currently on the National Council and he is a member of the Management Board, Chair of the Professional Development Board, and Chair of the Examination Board of the national professional body. He was awarded a Distinguished Community Fellowship at the University of Ulster in 2004 for outstanding work in the community.
