## Visit to Lok Ma Chau Spur Line Saturday 9 June 2007

The 7.4-kilometre Lok Ma Chau Spur Line will provide a second railway boundary crossing for commuters travelling between Hong Kong and the mainland. Upon its commissioning in mid 2007, the spur line will run from Sheung Shui to a new station at Lok Ma Chau where passengers will have direct transfer to Shenzhen Metro System. With kind permission given by the KCRC, members of the Chartered Institute of Housing Asian Pacific Branch and Hong Kong Institute of Housing will enjoy a preview on the infrastructure and facilities of the Lok Ma Chau Spur line on Saturday 9 June 2007 before it is expected to be officially launched later this year.
