## INTRODUCTION

The Bachelor of Housing Management programme is a 20-month part-time conversion programme that is designed to broaden and deepen the knowledge of the Professional Diploma in Housing Management graduates. It is run and taught by a committed group of full-time academic research and teaching staff, as well as practitioners from the field. The programme will enable graduates to:

- acquire academic training in housing studies;
- gain in-depth expertise and broader integrated knowledge forming a solid foundation for further career advancement;
- develop transferable knowledge and skills that are suitable to the changing demands of the housing profession in Hong Kong;
- study part-time for a degree qualification in housing management; and
- be eligible for continued study in the Master of Housing Management programme.



## ADMISSIONS

To be eligible for admission to the degree of Bachelor of Housing Management, candidates shall:

- comply with the General Regulations;
- hold a Professional Diploma in Housing Management (formerly known as Diploma in Housing Management or Certificate in Housing Management) awarded by the School of Professional and Continuing Education (formerly known as Department of Extra Mural Studies); and
- have at least three years of working experience in the housing field.

Candidates will be selected on the basis of their academic merit in the Professional Diploma course, working experience and performance at the interview (if required).

## COURSE STRUCTURE

The Honours Degree conversion programme will be offered on a part-time basis with a credit-based curriculum.

### First Year Courses

- Contemporary Housing Issues
- Community Organization and Social Policy
- Applied Social Research Methods
- Managing Quality
- Urban and Housing Theories
- Urban Planning and Urban Management

### Second Year Courses

- Public Administration and Public Sector Management
- Housing in Urban China
- Research Project

## PERIOD OF STUDY

The curriculum shall extend over 20 months of part-time study. Students are required to take three courses in each semester of the first year of study and two courses plus the Research Project in the first semester of the second year of study.

## ASSESSMENT AND AWARD

Each course will extend over one semester of study and will be assessed by means of coursework, project work or examinations. Students who have completed the curriculum and satisfied the examiners in assessment will be awarded the Bachelor of Housing Management by The University of Hong Kong.

## COURSE FEES

The composition fee for 2015-2016 is HK\$68,600 per year. The fees will be collected by three installments. The first and second installments will be collected at the beginning of each semester of year 1. The third installment will be collected at the beginning of the first semester of year 2. The composition fee only covers tuition fees for courses on offer and student's usage of University facilities, such as health clinic, sports centre and library facilities. It does not include fees such as costs for field trips, printing, binding, stationery, and books.

The methods of payment are detailed below:

Composition Fee (2015-2016):

First Year: HK\$68,600

Second Year: HK\$34,300

The composition fee for 2015-2016 is subject to final approval.

## APPLICATION PROCEDURES

The application form should be completed and returned to the Programme Director, Bachelor of Housing Management, together with

- a photocopy of applicant's Hong Kong Identity Card;
- supporting documentary proof of academic qualifications and work experience;
- a non-refundable application fee of HK\$450 made payable to 'The University of Hong Kong' by a crossed cheque or bank draft; and
- The completed application fee acknowledgment form.

Applications must be submitted no later than **2 January 2015**. Results of the admissions will be announced in April/May 2015 and the commencement date is September 2015.

Construction of the Hong Kong University Station (MTR West Island Line) is expected to be completed by 2014, which will shorten travelling time to HKU.
