Why Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) Matters

The air we breathe has both immediate and long-term effects on our health, influencing not only the respiratory system but overall wellbeing. Poor air quality can impair the respiratory and cardiovascular systems, leading to lasting consequences for quality of life and an increased risk of chronic disease.

Government Guidelines

Get up to speed on current standards and best practices for effective indoor air quality management. While government policies have played an important role in improving outdoor air quality, achieving clean air in indoor environments requires action at the institutional and individual levels. Every public and private organization has a responsibility to ensure good air quality within the spaces under its control.

Leading by Example

Discover how organizations and individuals can champion better air quality — raising awareness, influencing change, and setting higher standards. Some leading corporations have already adopted robust air quality controls in their offices and public spaces. Clean Air Network, a dedicated NGO focused on air quality advocacy and awareness since 2009, will share case studies and outline opportunities for participants to join the “Clean Air for All” initiative.

1. Dr. Daniel Ng, Founding President of the Asian Paediatric Pulmonology Society

Dr. Daniel Ng is the Founding President of the Asian Paediatric Pulmonology Society and an honorary council member of the Hong Kong Society of Paediatric Respiriology. He serves as an Honorary Consultant at Hong Kong Sanatorium & Hospital, Kwong Wah Hospital, and United Christian Hospital.

Dr. Ng has extensive experience in paediatric respiratory medicine, with a special focus on asthma, allergic rhinitis, pneumonia, and obstructive sleep apnea. His work in this field has heightened his awareness of the adverse health impacts of air pollution.

2. Patrick Fung, CEO, Clean Air Network

Patrick joined CAN in 2011 and has been serving as CEO since 2016. He was appointed by the HKSAR Government as an expert member of the Air Quality Objectives Review Working Group for the periods 2016-2018 and 2022-2023. He graduated from the Chinese University of Hong Kong and attended the Strategic Perspectives in Nonprofit Management Program at Harvard Business School.

He holds BEng, MSc(Eng), MArch & MURban Design from HKU, BBE(Arch) from QUT, MSt IDBE from the University of Cambridge, and PhD from PolyU. Tony actively serves the community in various voluntary capacities. He is the Vice Chairman of Professional Green Building Council, Director of Zero Carbon Building and Director of YMCA of Hong Kong. He also contributes his expertise to Town Planning Board, Environment and Conservation Fund Committee, Lantau Conservation Fund Advisory Committee, and Community Involvement Committee on Greening of HKSAR. His passion and contributions to green architecture and the creative industry have been recognized by receiving the HKSAR Medal of Honour in 2022, the Australia China Alumni Award for Arts and Creative Industries in 2018, and the Ten Outstanding Young Persons Award in 2016.
